Meeting Minutes

I. Call Meeting To Order

II. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

III. Chairman's Report

- Approve Minutes from Last Meeting – Corrections noted. Julie Eversole moved to approve the minutes. Carol Pett 2nd the motion. Council voted to approve the minutes.

IV. Presentation.

- Lisa Delgado presented on the School Age Parenting Program (SAPP)
- Brochures were distributed to Council members
- Program has been in place 20+ years. 13 staff
- Described program goals. Program is voluntary
- Described Program Services:
 - Case Management
 - Teen Parenting Classes
 - Career & Technology Classes
 - Compensatory Education Home Instruction
 - Education provided during postpartum time period so that there is no “break” in education during post-delivery recovery
 - Transportation
 - Tuition Assistance
 - Child Care (NISD - Growing Tree Child Development Center)
 - Also provides newborn nursery
 - Staffed by volunteers
 - Lending Closet

- Noted that student can stay involved for the duration of their education (e.g., 6th grader can continue with services through 12th grade)
- Also noted that the program has circumstances where they are now working with students who are the children of previous program participants
- Community Partnerships help students receive needed services and minimize absences:
 - WIC
 - OB/GYN
 - Child Care Services (CCS)
 - 40 Contracted Child Care Centers
- Demographics
 - 477 Students Served
 - 87% Female 13% Male
 - 84% Hispanic 8% Anglo, 6% African-American, 2% other
 - 57% Free and Reduced Lunch
 - 128 Receive CEHI
 - 310 Infants/children served
 - 16% Met homeless eligibility
 - 15% Special Education
- Discussed District Distribution
- Provided Metropolitan Health District Bexar County Pregnancy Rates
- Funding Streams
 - TEA formula grants (which are proposed to be cut)
 - Weighted Average Daily Attendance reimbursement
 - Perkins Career & Technology funding
 - Connections Homeless Program funding
 - State & Federal Program funds
 - Special Education funds
- Lisa Delgado responded to questions from the Council

V. District Facilitator's Report

- Linda Seewald introduced a guest H.C. Grimet, Teaching and Learning Specialist for Physical Education and Health from Katy ISD. He is a member of the Katy ISD SHAC.
- No other reports noted.

VI. Committee Chairs' Report

Committee Chair's include:

- a. Campus Assessment Committee, Suzanne Levan, Chair – nothing to report
- b. Sexuality Education Committee, Rudy Sanchez, Chair – nothing to report

- c. Student Recruitment, Bryce Chatland, Chair
 - Inquired about anticipated deadline to submit student representative nominations. It was suggested to target mid-April.
 - Given time frame and the fact that there is no scheduled SHAC for March, Committee asked if they could finalize the student representatives nominations and submit those directly to the District Facilitator
 - They also asked if the potential student representatives could visit/monitor SHAC prior to actual appointments
 - It was determined that SHAC could approve the student representatives and that potential student reps could attend even prior to School Board meeting
 - There was no rush on submitting the applications
 - Discussed how best to recruit students– high schools vs. Board regions
 - Proposing to send out an invitation and application to every high school head counselor/principal
 - It is likely that not every high school student representative would be able to attend every meeting
 - Committee will be working on the application process and scoring criteria
- d. Recruitment Committee, Julie Eversole, Chair – nothing to report
- e. Legislative Committee, Paul Tucker, Chair
 - Linda Seewald distributed a list of some of the proposed legislation
 - Legislation proposed to put health curriculum back in as a course requirement
 - Legislation proposed to reinstate physical education requirements
 - Legislation proposed that requires schools to develop a comprehensive food allergy protocol
- f. Health Report Card Committee, Jeannie Von Stultz, Chair
 - Described the intent of the committee and 4 key areas that the committee would like to highlight
 - Linda Seewald introduced this process to the District in order to determine next steps
 - It was determined that it would be important to discuss this with District Administration including those connected to Public Relations
 - It was suggested that it would also be important to include the District data department

VII. Members' and Advisors' Reports

- Lisa Patterson reported on Asthma Education efforts within the District.
 - A course (Asthma Education 101) is being provided to coaches and PE teachers.
 - Demonstrated brochure/book that will be provided to all participants

- Bryce Chatland distributed information regarding an Ironman for Kids fundraiser. Funds are raised to provide kids with Trisomy (or other disorders) modified bikes
