# What Not to Wear

Refer to the District Handbook for additional information. This list is not inclusive –

Final determination of acceptable dress and grooming rests with campus administration.

**Keep These Items At Home!**

I Pods, MP3 players, cameras, video games, electronic devices, liquid paper, paint pens, permanent markers, and other items that may cause a distraction in school are considered nuisance items.



Cell phones are allowed on campus, but must be turned off and out of sight before and during school. Cell phones and other nuisance items will be confiscated if misused and a parent or guardian will be required to pick up the item.

**No sagging/bagging pants**



**No torn or ripped jeans or clothing**



**No plain white undershirts, hoods (do not wear in building), or any indecent or inappropriate patches, writings, or drawings on clothing**



**No midriffs** – make sure shirt is long enough to cover the waist when sitting, standing, walking, etc.



**No Costumes, Caps, Masks, Ears, tails, etc..**



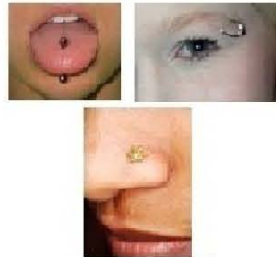
**No Athletic Shorts/Gear** allowed outside of Athletics/Organizations



**No Tank Tops**  
There is no 3 finger rule.



**No facial or tongue piercings.**



**No chains or spikes on clothing, jewelry, or accessories.**



**No headgear** (caps, hats, beanies, do-rags, scarves, bandannas, sunglasses, etc)



Girls' capris and gauchos must be 4" below the knee. **NO SHORTS**, for girls or boys.



**No pajamas or slippers**



Unconventional colored, multicolored, spiked, or mohawk hair styles are not permitted.



**No low cut, strapless, sleeveless, tank tops, racerback, or spaghetti strap shirts**



Skirt length must be no more than 4" above the knee, even with leggings/tights. No shorts



No Tights, Leggings, or Jeggings can be worn as pants. Blouse/ Top used with tights, leggings, or jeggings must be thigh length front and back.

**PARENTS, PLEASE NOTE:** If your child violates the dress code, you will be contacted and asked to bring a change of clothes. If you are unable to do so, your child may not return to class for the remainder of the day. Piercings, hats, and other items may be confiscated. Repeated offenses will result in disciplinary actions.
