Title I and Education

Under federal law schools with high numbers of students who are economically disadvantaged will receive funding for educational purposes. These funds are strictly regulated. When a campus spends this money they must follow a detailed outline and align this spending using research-based instructional practices. It is important, and a federal requirement, that parents in the community have the opportunity to learn about the Title I program.

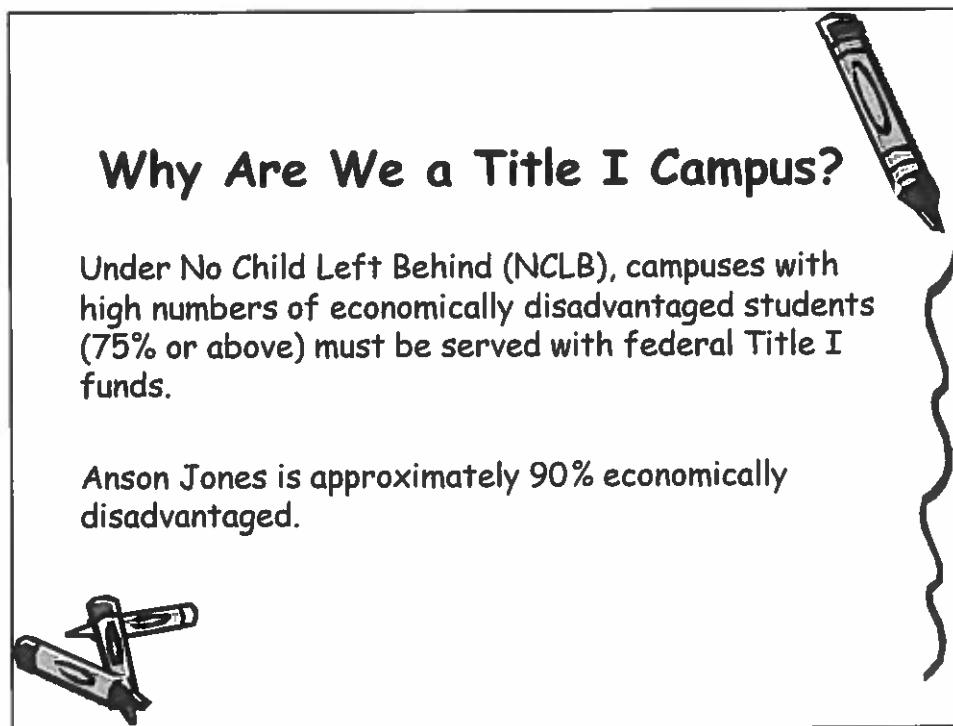
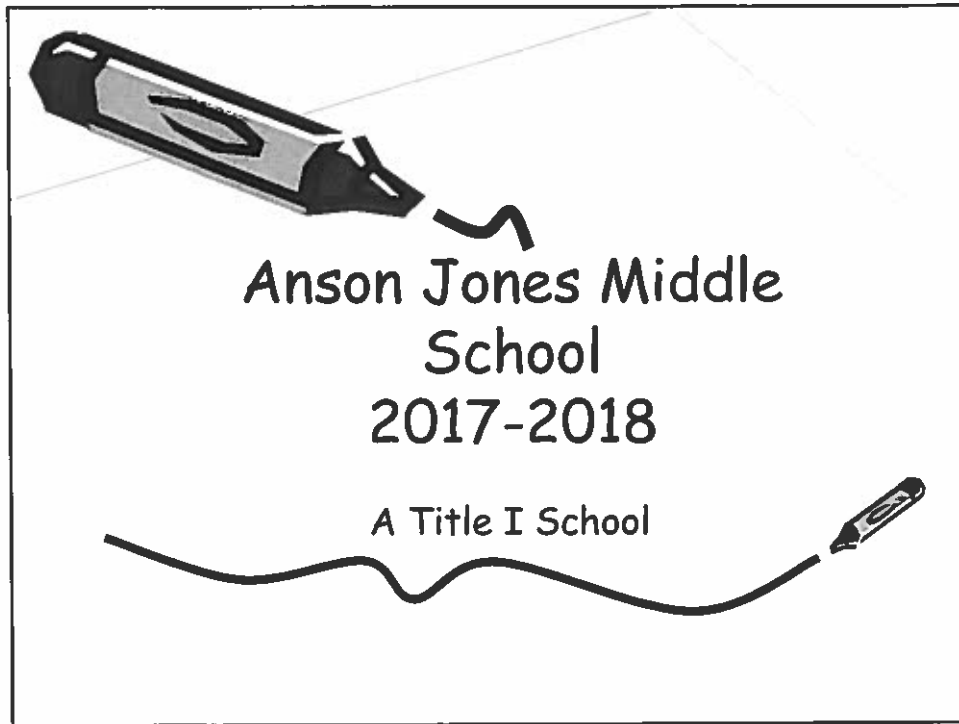
The economically disadvantaged enrollment at Anson Jones is approximately 90%. We receive around \$603,000 from the federal government to help educate our students. We use this money to fund a math specialist, reading specialist, academic support teacher, and an additional counselor. This money is also used to purchase instructional supplies and provide tutoring for our students. Furthermore, the quality of teaching is improved by using Title I funds to provide staff development for the campus.


Anson Jones takes great pride in being good stewards of this federal funding and closely monitors all expenses to ensure maximum benefit through quality education.

A Title I program is designed to help students achieve academic success by providing additional opportunities through supplemental funds.



How Does this Happen?

Anson Jones receives approximately \$603,000 from the federal government that must be spent according to strict guidelines. Title I schools must use scientifically research-based instructional strategies and implement a parental involvement program.

Ten Schoolwide Components

3. Instruction by highly qualified staff
4. On-Going Professional Development
5. Strategies to attract highly qualified teachers



Ten Schoolwide Components

6. Strategies to increase parental involvement
7. Strategies to assist preschool children in the transition to elementary school
8. Include teachers in decisions regarding assessments
9. Activities to assist students having difficulty with state assessments (STAAR)
10. Integration of Federal, State, and Local Services and Programs
