# Do You Need to Apply?

If you answer **YES** to any of these questions, then you should complete the ApplyTexas application:

- You will take **Dual Credit** for the **FIRST TIME** in the 2025-2026 school year.
  - *AP and OR courses are NOT dual credit and you must still apply if you've only taken those courses.*
- It's been a year or more since you took a dual credit class.
  - Example:
    - 2023-2024: Took Spanish 3 D
    - 2024-2025: No dual credit classes
    - 2025-2026: Should reapply to take additional dual credit classes


