Superintendent's Report

Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- **Inclement weather**. NISD joined others in the Central Texas area in navigating the recent weather conditions. Classes are set to resume Wednesday, Jan. 22 with cold temperatures expected.
- **Staff Planning Day**. The Superintendent reported positive feedback from many staff members who appreciated the planning day built into this year's school calendar following the Winter Break.
- Leadership Northside. The next cohort of Leadership Northside participants began at the perfect time, coinciding with the start of the legislative session. Principal Coach Nicole Franco and Executive Director of Teaching & Learning Diana Ely organized and facilitated the cohort.
- **NISD Museum Association**. Dr. Craft expressed his appreciation to the Museum Association members for their active engagement and support of the District.
- NISD Council of PTAs. Despite having to be rescheduled, the NISD Council of PTAs hosted a well-attended council meeting that Dr. Craft enjoyed attending.
- Rawlinson MS Staff Member. Dr. Craft was proud to recognize and honor Rawlinson MS social studies teacher Hyla Finlayson as she celebrated her 75th birthday in the same year the District celebrates its 75th anniversary. Finlayson, Northside's most tenured classroom teacher, began her career at Holmes HS before moving to Stinson and then Rawlinson middle schools.
- **Texas Legislative Session**. State legislators kicked off the 89th legislative session on Jan. 14 and elected Dustin Burrows as Speaker of the House.

She acknowledged the Fine Arts Department at **Brandeis HS** on their recent performance of Matilda and reported that **Clark HS** will perform the musical production of Cinderella. Saldana is appreciative of the kind messages she and other Trustees have received during Board Appreciation Month.
- **Trustee David Salcido** has been actively participating in the NCAA Read to the Final Four Literacy Challenge by reading to several elementary classrooms.
- **Trustee Homer Guevara** thanked **Holmes HS** Coach **Pete Padilla** for inviting him to the Husky Christmas breakfast in December. He attended an enrichment day at **Westwood Terrace ES**, highlighting health and physical health. the City of San Antonio website. Duran recognized the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday celebrated on Jan. 20 and referenced a telegram message from King to Cesar Chavez that she found inspiring.

- **Trustee Carol Harle** will be attending the Mayor's Smart Challenge event which will feature over 500 students from the San Antonio area and good representation from NISD. Board approves audit of District's financial report

The Board approved the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) audit for the fiscal year ending August 31, 2024. The report consists of management's representations concerning the financial condition and operations of the District and the results of an audit performed by the certified public accounting firm of Whitley Penn. The audit was conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. The auditors have expressed an unmodified opinion, which is the highest level of assurance that the financial statements are free of material misstatement, according to Tiffany Contreras, Assistant Superintendent for Business & Finance.
