# Superintendent's Report

# Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- **Graduations**. It was an exciting end to the school year, as 13 graduation ceremonies were held and completed, and 7.024 hands were shaken.
- Increased number of scholarships. The Class of 2024 earned \$194 million in scholarships, compared to \$181.4 million last school year.
- Reddix Celebration. A favorite event each year is the "Transition Celebration for the Reddix Center students. This event marks the beginning of adult life for around 60 students who are transitioning from an education setting into a work setting. It is always such an emotional time for the families and the staff and a reminder of our "why."
- Leadership TASB. Congratulations to Vice President Corinne Saldana, the latest NISD Trustee to earn the status of Master Trustee through the Leadership TASB Program.
- James B. Crowe Award. Congratulations to Board President Bobby Blount for receiving the 2024 James B. Crow Innovation in Governance Award from TASB. He was presented with the award during the recent Summer Leadership Institute held in San Antonio.
- Walkthrough Chumbley ES. We recently held a walkthrough with Namesake M'Lissa Chumbley at the new Chumbley Elementary School, which will open in August 2024.
- Support Leadership Institute. Tomorrow is the Support Leadership Institute, which involves department leaders (non-instructional). The theme is the 75th anniversary, and sessions will focus on building leadership skills and honing customer service expectations. Thanks to the SLI Design Team, who organized what will be a great event.

### Trustees approve Flexible School Day for Chavez Academy

Trustees approved an optional flexible school day for the Chavez Academy for the 2024-2025 school year. This is an annual application that must be submitted to TEA if districts plan to participate in the Optional Flexible School Day Program. The goal of this program in NISD's Chavez Excel Academy is to improve graduation rates for students who are in danger of dropping out of school, have dropped out, or are behind in core subject courses.

### Trustees hear 2024-25 Expenditure Budget Update

District staff presented to Trustees the preliminary 2024-2025 General Fund, Child Nutrition and Debt Service budget summaries. At a later Board meeting, Trustees are expected to call for a public hearing to be held at a regular Board meeting.
