## Superintendent's Report

## Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- Catching Up With Craft-Video Era. Catching Up with Craft was formerly a written message sent to all staff every week. It is now in a video format and can be found at <a href="https://www.nisd.net/district/catching-up-with-craft">https://www.nisd.net/district/catching-up-with-craft</a>.
- Enrollment Data and Attendance Push/Incentives. With enrollment currently at 99,699, initiatives will be implemented to continue to grow student enrollment, in particular at the Pre-K level.
- Football season kicked off with new video boards. The District's athletic season has had a great start, including the launch of the new video boards at both Gus and Farris stadiums.
- 9/11 Remembrance at Marshall HS. Marshall HS/LMS held a ceremony early on Sept. 11 to remember the 2,977 people killed in the terror attacks in 2001 as well as to honor those who served on the frontline as first responders.
- Project ACORN Kick-Off. A kick-off event for Project ACORN was held at Los Reyes ES recently. Thanks to Amalia Sollars and Issac Esquivel for organizing it.
- CBAC Meeting. The Citizens Bond Advisory Committee (SBAC) met recently. Thanks to the members for serving.
- **NSITE Mentor Luncheon**. Dr. Craft applauded the NSITE mentoring program and appreciated all of the mentors and mentees participating in it.
- Child Cancer Recognition at Lieck ES. Pre-K student Declan DeLeon and his mother are working with Principal Jess Garza to raise awareness of childhood cancer. Four-year-old Declan is a cancer survivor.
- **NEF Pillar Recognition**. The Northside Education Foundation (NEF) hosted a Pillar Reception that brought together the 2024 Pillars of Character and the Pillars from the previous 24 years.
- **NEF Giving Campaign**. The Annual Giving Campaign is well underway and is an opportunity for staff and community members to support the NEF and the innovative initiatives it supports.
- **KENS5 EXCEL Teacher Recognition. Melinda Valdez**, a STEM teacher at Beard Elementary School, was named the 2024-25 EXCEL Award winner for NISD.
- TEPSA Student Leadership Award. In 2018, the Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association (TEPSA) established the TEPSA Student Leadership Award to honor outstanding student leadership teams and their impact on our school communities in the state of Texas. NISD had four campuses qualify: Esparza, Lieck, Ott, and Scobee elementary schools.

## **Board Members' Report**

- **Trustee Bobby Blount** spoke of txEDCON, an annual conference for school board members, superintendents, and administrators, as an opportunity for educational leaders from across the state to gather and connect.
- Trustee Corinne Saldana thanked all of the District's coaches and band directors and all those working with and
  guiding students. Saldana said the NEF Pillar Reception was exceptional and especially enjoyed interacting with
  former Holmes HS students honored at Pillars. She attended the 9/11 Remembrance at Marshall HS and felt it was a

beautiful tribute. Saldana commended the work of the video board teams at Gus and Farris stadiums and said they are doing an amazing job running the new stadium videoboards. She encouraged Trustees to consider assisting with the distribution of the NEF New Teacher Grant awards on Oct. 4.

- **Trustee David Salcido** mentioned that of the 541 schools in Texas awarded the Purple Star designation by the Texas Education Agency (TEA), 105 are Northside ISD schools.
- Trustee Dr. Homer Guevara thanked Nicole Franco, Principal Coach, and Diana Ely, Executive Director of Teaching and Learning, for their work in facilitating Leadership Northside.
- Trustee Dr. Karla Duran thanked Dr. Craft for recognizing Hispanic Heritage Month. She acknowledged Northside's recognition of America's Heroes Week, honoring first responders and military personnel. Duran announced that Alamo Colleges will host a Dual Credit Conference on Oct. 5 at ESC-Region 20. Duran touted a program developed by Lisa Coleman, Soy Latina, aimed at developing leadership skills in females ages 15-18.
- Trustee Dr. Carol Harle expressed how pleased she was that 105 NISD schools earned the Purple Star campus designation for the 2024-2025 school year from the Texas Education Agency (TEA). This year's total number of recipients is up from only ten last school year. Harle reminded Trustees that the deadline for submitting nominations for the H-E-B Excellence in Education Award is Oct. 7. She spoke on the importance of voting and referenced the work of the Youth Do Vote organization and the great opportunities it offers for students. Harle also announced that Raise Your Hand Texas will host a candidate forum on Oct. 17 and 19. She spoke of the passing of Marshall HS classmate Robin Boldt, whose father, Herbert Boldt, is the namesake of Boldt ES. Harle acknowledged Dr. Kimberly Ridgley, Assistant Superintendent of Whole Child, and her work with a Mental Health Summit planned for Nov. 4.
- Trustee Karen Freeman acknowledged Beard ES STEM teacher Melinda Valdez on her KENS5 EXCEL recognition. She enjoyed being on hand when the award was presented. Freeman thanked Linebarger Law Firm for sponsoring the NEF Pillar Reception. She congratulated all Esports competitors and encouraged others to attend an esports competition.
