# Superintendent's Report

# Dr. John Craft reported to the Board:

- October is National Principals Month. Thanks to all our district principals for their leadership, dedication, and passion, which make a huge difference in the lives of our students and staff every day.
- National Custodial Appreciation Day. Oct. 2 was National Custodial Appreciation Day. Thank you to our incredible custodial staff who work hard to keep our schools clean, safe, and welcoming. Their hard work behind the scenes ensures a healthy environment for learning and growth.
- **TASA/TASB Conference.** NISD had 100% attendance from Trustees at the conference, which was an opportunity for education and advocacy. In addition, visual art student groups from **Stevens HS** and **Rayburn MS** were chosen to represent the Texas Art Education Association at the conference. Students showcased innovative, choice-based artistic processes led by their teachers, **Ambra Hernandez** from Stevens HS and **Larry West** from Rayburn MS.
- **NISD Family Engagement Conference**. A successful event was held at NAC, with approximately 400 in attendance.
- Ag in Action. ASTA hosted Ag in Action in early October. This unique three-day event provides elementary students with a hands-on learning experience that connects with their science, math, and geography curriculum, offering them a meaningful, real-world perspective on agriculture. Since its inception in 1998, nearly 43,000 fourth graders and 8,800 high school students have participated.
- **TechEd Conference**. The Texas Education Technology Leaders (TETL) conference was held with the theme, "Lead it Like Lasso."
- Education Human Resources Day. Oct. 9 was Texas Education Human Resources Day. A special thanks to all
  those in our Human Resources Department who work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure our schools and
  departments are staffed with the very best employees.
- **National School Lunch Week.** National School Lunch Week was Oct. 14-18. Many thanks to all our dedicated Child Nutrition employees who provide meals to students daily. They are projected to serve an incredible 16.5 million meals this school year.
- Northside AP Honor Roll Campuses. NISD boasts seven high schools designated as Advanced Placement (AP) Honor Roll Campuses. They are Brandeis, Clark, Communications Arts, Harlan, Health Careers, NSITE, and O'Connor high schools.

- **Be Well Stay Well.** The Whole Child Department hosted its 5<sup>th</sup> annual Be Well, Stay Well event this past weekend, providing a variety of educational sessions focused on physical, social, emotional, and financial wellness.
- UIL Marching Band. This past Saturday, all NISD high school bands competed at the UIL Region 29 Marching Band Contest, and ALL district bands received Superior Ratings (Division 1) and advanced to the Area Marching Contest round to be held this coming Saturday for Jay High School in the 5A competition. The rest will compete in the 6A competition on Saturday, Nov. 2.

- Red Ribbon Week. Red Ribbon Week is Oct. 23-31. Schools will hold a variety of events to celebrate.

He also provided an update on leadership changes for both Go Public and UP Partnerships.
- Trustee Corinne Saldana attended the Harlan Heroes Inclusion Pep Rally at Harlan HS, an event that has been in place since the school's second year and one that has proved to be amazing. She recognized Harlan staff members Monica Gonzales and Rachel DeLeon for their part in organizing the event. Saldana visited Braun Station ES and participated in a campus celebration for the school exceeding their NEF Annual Giving campaign goal. Saldana also attended the Clark HS Freedom Walk event and the Ag in Action event at ASTA at O'Connor HS and assisted with a NEF new teacher grant distribution. - Trustee Dr. Karla Duran enjoyed hearing from astronaut Miguel Hernandez on his migrant family's experience while at the recent TASA/TASB conference. She congratulated and thanked the NISD staff who attended a recent dual credit academy hosted at Region 20 and indicated that the Alamo Colleges will hold an EduTech event on Nov. 15. Duran referenced a recent opportunity to provide training to teachers in Columbia. She reminded voters that early voting has started and encouraged them to exercise their right to vote. #### Public hearing: NISD earns highest financial rating 22 years in a row

Assistant Superintendent for Budget & Finance **Tiffany Contreras** reported that for the 22<sup>nd</sup> year in a row, Northside ISD has received the highest rating of "Superior Achievement" under the state's financial accountability rating system, called the School Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). The primary goal of School FIRST is to improve the management of the school district's financial resources. The School FIRST rating is based upon analysis of staff and student data reported for the 2022-2023 school year, and budgetary and financial data for the 2023 fiscal year. As required by state law, Northside ISD announced and held a public meeting to distribute a financial management report that explains the District's performance under each of the 20 indicators and the District's rating.

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# Trustees hear a report on Early College High School program proposal

Dr. Jerry Woods, Assistant Superintendent for High School Administration, presented a plan to develop an Early College High School program to be housed at Jay High School. The ECHS program would allow students to earn an associate's degree along with their high school diploma. The program will start next year and will be open to students from Connally, Jones, Jordan, Neff, Pease, Rayburn, Ross, Rudder, Stevenson, and Vale middle schools.

### **Trustees hear report on State Funding**

Dr. Rene Barajas, Deputy Superintendent for Business and Finance, presented an overview of the state's Tier I and Tier II funding. The Trustees then discussed the possibility of a future bond and voter-approved tax ratification election. The presentation was informational only, and no action was taken.
