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Attendance Information

Student attendance not only affects credits (graduation), it also affects:

- Obtaining a VOE (Verification of Enrollment)
 needed to attend Driver's Education classes & to take
 the driver's test for a driver's license.
- Students wanting to attend school-sponsored dances including prom must be in good academic standing, to include grades, attendance, and discipline, as per the John Jay Student Handbook.




Checking Out students from the school

If a parent/guardian needs to pick up their student early from school for an appointment or any other reason. A parent/guardian will need to come to the attendance office in person to sign out their child. The student will then be called to the office by the attendance secretary. Please remember that students will not be released to any person other than the parent/guardian noted on their emergency contact list and must present a valid ID.

ATTENDANCE Matters



Texas Compulsory Attendance Law

Students must attend class 90% of the school year

Unexcused & Excused Absences

ALL absences count! Students who have more than 17 (year long course) total or 7 Fall/10 Spring absences are at risk of failing. Parent/Guardians may also be issued a municipal court warning and possibly pay a fine.





Medical Appointments

ALL absences count! Students who have more than 17 (year long course) total or 7 Fall/10 Spring absences are at risk of failing. Parent/Guardians may also be issued a municipal court warning and possibly pay a fine.

If a student's attendance case is sent to court, a committee will take into consideration how many absences were excused and unexcused.





High School Credits

Students who have not been in attendance for 90% of each class will not earn credits for the affected courses. In this case, please speak to the counselor or administrator about attendance recovery as soon as possible.

Communication

If your child is ill and will be out of school for more than 1 day, please inform the Attendance Secretaries. They should be your first line of communication

If a student is out for a doctors appointment, a doctor's note needs to be provided to the attendance office.



For a student who has a medical or court appointment during school hours and submits a note to the attendance office, the classes missed will not be considered an absence.



10 & 10 Rule & Hall Passes

- You are NOT allowed to be in the halls the first 10 and the last 10 minutes of class time
- This time is for admin to clear the halls and bathrooms
- · Campus safety





- You must have a pink pass or hall pass issued by your teacher to be in the hallway
- If you don't have a pass? We will ask you to return to class





Attendance



- The state of Texas requires all students to be present 90% of the time in order for credit to be awarded.
- If a student has more than 7 absences during the first semester course, more than 10 absences for a second semester course, or more than 17 absences in a year long course they will be denied credit for the course.



Attendance



- If you are <u>more than 5 minutes</u> late to ANY period, you are <u>absent</u>.
- The bell to be in class 1st period is 9:00 am.
- If you are coming in late, you will go straight to your class. You do NOT need a pass from the attendance office to go to class.

Tardies

- You must arrive to all classes on time and be prepared to learn
- You have have <u>5 minutes</u> to move from one class to another
- If you are Tardy to class, teachers will mark you Tardy in the gradebook
- Students with excessive tardies will be called into the office and assigned consequences

STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and Shelter.

HOLD

"In Your Room or Area. Clear the Halls.

Students are trained to:

- · Clear the hallways and remain in their room or area until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual
- Adults and staff are trained to: Close and lock the door
- · Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

SECURE

Get Inside. Lock outside doors"

Students are trained to:

- Return to inside of building
- Do business as usual Adults and staff are trained to:
- Bring everyone indoors
- Lock outside doors
- Increase situational awareness Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual



"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight

- Students are trained to:
- Move away from sight Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Adults and staff are trained to:
- · Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- Move away from sight Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE

'To a Location' Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone
- Follow instructions

Adults and staff are trained to:

- Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to take anything with them, dependent on reason for
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults

SHELTER "State Hazard and Safety Strategy"

Hazards might include:

- Tornado
- Hazmat
- Earthquake
- Tsunami
- Safety Strategies might include:
- Evacuate to shelter area
- Seal the room
- Drop, cover and hold
- · Get to high ground

STANDARD RESPONSE PROTOCOL PARENT GUIDANCE

Get Inside. Lock outside doors'

SECURE



Secure was formerly called Modified Lockdown, and the actions are the same. It is called when there's something dangerous outside of the building. Students and staff are brought into the building and the outside doors will be locked. The school might display the Building is Secured poster on entry doors or is. Inside, it will be business as usual.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A SECURE EVENT? Probably not. Every effort is made to conduct classes as normal duing a secure event. Additionally, par-SCHOOL IS SECURED

ents may be asked to stay outside during a Secure event.

WHAT IF PARENTS NEED
TO PICK UP THEIR
STUDENT?
Depending on the situation, it may
not be safe to release the student. ESCUELA BAJO PROTECCIÓN As the situation evolves, Secure might change to a Monitored Entry and/or Controlled Release.

WILL PARENTS BE NOTIFIED WHEN A

SCHOOL GOES INTO SECURE? When a Secure condition is brief or the hazard is non-violent, like a wild animal on the playground, there may not be a need to notify parents while the Secure is in place.

With longer or more dangerous events, the school should notify parents that the school has increased their security.

LOCKDOWN



"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight"
A Lockdown is called when there is something dangerous inside of the building. Students and staff are trained to enter or remain in a room that can be locked, and maintain silence.

A Lockdown is only initiated when there is an active threat inside or very close to the building.

SHOULD PARENTS COME TO THE SCHOOL DURING A LOCKDOWN?

DURING A LOCKDOWN?
The natural inclination for parents is to go to the school during a Lockdown. Understandable, but perhaps problematic. If there is a threat inside the building, law enforcement will be responding, it is unlikely that parents will be granted access to the building or even the campus. If parents are all the control of ready in the school, they will be instructed to Lockdown as

SHOULD PARENTS TEXT THEIR STUDENTS?

The school recognizes the importance of communication between parents and students during a Lockdown event. Parents should be aware though, during the initial period of a Lockdown, it may not be safe for students to text their parents. As the situation resolves, students may be asked to update their parents on a regular basis.

In some cases, students may be evacuated and transported off-site for a student-parent reunification.

WHAT ABOUT UNANNOUNCED DRILLS?

UNANNOUNCED DHILLS?
The school may conduct unscheduled drills, however it is highly discouraged to conduct one without
announcing that it is a drill. That's
called an unannounced drill and can
cause undue concern and stress.

Parents should recognize that the school will always inform students that it is a drill during the initial announcement.



A drill is used to create the "muscle memory" associ-ated with a practiced action. There is no simulation of an event, simply performing the action.




