Why does Northside ISD have a 1:1 student device program?

Technology plays a vital role in today's educational experience, with students needing to access digital materials and complete assignments daily in class and at home. Northside ISD has implemented a 1:1 student device program to allow every student to check out a district-owned device. This initiative fosters equitable learning, enabling full engagement with digital materials and the development of technology skills. Students in Kindergarten through 1st grades have 1:1 access to iPads, while those in 2nd through 12th grades use Chromebooks.

Caring for your District-Issued Device

At school and home, parents and students share the responsibility of safeguarding and maintaining district-assigned devices and chargers. Promptly report any issues, damage, or theft to campus staff. If a device or charger is lost or damaged, families may be liable for repair or replacement costs.

To ensure their continued availability, these resources must be returned at the end of the school year, when you transfer to a new campus, or when you withdraw from the district. Your cooperation in caring for district-issued devices is greatly appreciated. These devices contribute to a safe and effective digital learning environment for all students.
