- Students will select various passages from their memoir and analyze the rhetorical situation. These timed writing
  assignments will require students to draw inferences and/or construct conclusions about elements
   including but

   the speaker, the occasion, the audience, the purpose, the actual subject matter, and the various tones
  of the passages.
- Students will draw inspiration from their memoir when composing their own personal narrative essay.
