These timed writing assignments will require students to draw inferences and/or construct conclusions about elements—including but limited to—the speaker, the occasion, the audience, the purpose, the actual subject matter, and the various tones of the passages.
- Students will draw inspiration from their memoir when composing their own personal narrative essay.
